The Foothills Food Bank — A Source of Hope and Help

Pam Di Pietro Nears Retirement



Pam Di Pietro, the executive director of the Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center, will retire at the end of the year after 18 years of service. When she joined the organization, the Food Bank only served about 40 local families per month. Today, it has become one of the most respected food banks in Maricopa County and serves almost 7,000 seniors and families annually from its Cave Creek and Black Canyon City locations.

During her tenure, Pam has had many notable achievements. The following represent just a few:

- Opening a second location in Black Canyon City in 2017 and growth from 400 square feet to 11,400 square feet.
- Creating a Snack Pack program to provide weekend food for over 200 children.
- Creating the Adopt-A-Family holiday giving program serving over 533 client families and seniors.
- Expanding financial assistance and resources to clients who need help paying for rent, utilities, medical bills or to fund car repairs, providing over \$85,000 in aid.
- Expanding our volunteer base to 400 individuals donating over 40,000 hours.
- Developing deep relationships with St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance, three St. Vincent de Paul conferences, the Salvation Army, Arizona Association of Food Banks, Alliance of Arizona Non-Profits, Foothills Caring Corps, Carefree Kiwanis, American Legion Local #34 and other community businesses and organizations.
- Secured one van donated by Kiwanis, then five refrigerated trucks from an anonymous donor.
- Shepherded financial assets to leave all of the Food Bank facilities mortgage-free.

Pam's unrelenting vision to fight hunger but also give families hope to move forward by providing a safe, comfortable and dignified place to get food and meet with kind, helpful staff and volunteers is a blessing to the community. The extensive network of food retail partners helps bridge the gap of food insecurity.

In retirement, Pam will continue to serve on the Maricopa Human Services Commission, on which she has served for the past four years.

Pam's giant heart has impacted the lives of hundreds of thousands of people. What a legacy to be proud of! We wish her a long and happy retirement.
