2020 was an extraordinary year for the Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center. The Covid-19 pandemic increased the need for our services at the same time as requiring changes to our normal procedures in order to keep clients, staff and volunteers safe. Instead of entering the facility to shop for their weekly and monthly food, clients have been served by waiting outside for their supplies to be assembled and then driving in to pick them up. Similarly, our annual Adopt-A-Family holiday events, which in the past have included large indoor parties when clients collected their gifts, were transformed into festive drive-through events. ## Scottsdale Bible Church

Scottsdale Bible Church is a community of Christ followers striving to display and be marked by unwavering faith and unconditional love. They are currently meeting online and in person. Nearly 3,000 SBC members are involved in service opportunities within the church and local ministry partners. Local volunteer opportunities include supporting non-profits addressing hunger, foster care, poverty and homelessness, medical needs, senior and veterans' services and more.



The Food Bank has greatly benefitted from the generosity of SBC's North Campus church. For the past 10 years, annual food drives have generated between 1,514 lbs. to 7,241 lbs. of donated food. This year's drive at Thanksgiving generated 3,131 lbs.



The first drive was a peanut and jelly competition for the children attending the vacation bible school program. It has now expanded to a weekly collection during their drives encouraging the donation of items on the Food Bank wish list. Many thanks to our wonderful partners at Scottsdale Bible Church for their continued support!

## Anthem Giving Circle

The concept behind the Anthem Giving Circle is that its members give their time, energy and donations to help fill the needs of families in our community. This small but mighty group helps the Food Bank to assemble snack packs to distribute to schools and "fixins" boxes for Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners and also conducts monthly food drives.



This year, Anthem Giving Circle provided \$900 in VISA gift cards and 43 family games to our Adopt-A-Family program. We are a proud beneficiary of their charitable nature.

## KNIX Million Meal Crusade

For the Thanksgiving holiday, the Food Bank received over 200 complete meals through St. Vincent de Paul and their partnership with the 102.5 KNIX Million Meal Crusade at participating Albertsons and Safeway stores. Customers could donate cans, cash or "turkey bucks" to feed needy families across the entire valley. The meals consisted of a turkey, stuffing, potatoes, gravy, green bean casserole, cranberries and rolls.

## Boulders Golf Community

During this pandemic, clever fundraising is a must. Our friends, The Divine 9's and Mulligans golf groups at The Boulders, had a solution to reach out to their members with a virtual fundraiser called "Boulders Give Thanks and Give Back" to support three local charities whose clients' needs were greater than ever. Starting in October, members could drop off checks at the Boulders pro shop or go online to donate directly to the charity organizations.

Foothills Food Bank received \$14,225 in checks plus online donations to support our mission. In addition, our Adopt-A-Family program received 179 \$50 Walmart or VISA gift cards from our generous supporters at the Boulders, an increase of 51 from last year. Their continued support makes a meaningful impact in our community and we are forever grateful.



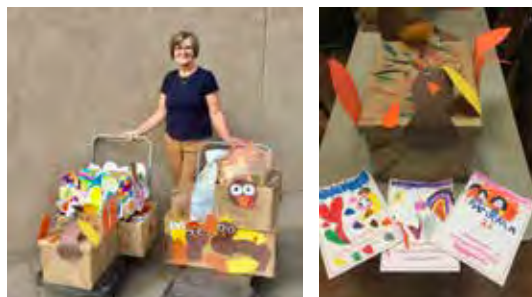
## Desert Foothills Lutheran Church

# Spreading Holiday Cheer

## Adopt-A-Family 2020

Planning a holiday celebration during a pandemic was certainly a challenge. Nevertheless, our 18th year of Adopt-A-Family was once again a big success. Our group and individual donors made the holidays bright for 444 registered Food Bank clients totaling 1,222 individuals. Instead of wrapped gifts, we asked donors to donate gift cards and new family games. Each person received a \$50 gift card and each family received playing cards, a food treat, a new family game and a bag of books. The gift cards provided family members the flexibility to buy Christmas gifts, pay a bill, purchase a haircut or enjoy a family outing. Families who signed up late were easily accommodated by the generosity of our donors.

A very special thank you to Food Bank staff and volunteers who signed up clients for the program and friends and volunteers who helped host two festive drive-through client parties, one in Black Canyon City and one at the Holland Center.



- **Universal Solar America** made a \$5,000 donation to Adopt-A-Family this year to help us provide each client with a gift card. John Bereckis, the company's CEO and founder, is proud to support the Food Bank's efforts to provide food, resources and financial assistance to families in need. Earlier this fall, John also donated 5,000 masks to the Food Bank for staff and client protection.



- **What a donation!** Kids Need to Read supplied us with over 500 "Families Need to Read" bags filled with new books and activities for all ages and hours of fun, a donation valued at \$28,683. Each family bag included a flyer that pointed out the importance of spending quality time together with tips on building reading skills and inspiring imagination. We are grateful for our partnership with the Kids Need to Read organization and look forward to expanding their reading outreach efforts to more families via our Snack Pack program for children.



- **The North Valley Young Marines** provided traffic control at our Holland Center drive-through client holiday party. The Young Marines are a national program for boys and girls between ages 8-18 that focuses on teaching the importance of self-confidence, academic achievement, community service and good citizenship.



- Once again, **the firefighters of the Rural Metro Fire Department** came to the rescue! For the past 7 years, the Fire Department has manned a booth outside Walmart to collect new toys, bikes, family games, gift cards and monetary donations from the community. Because of Covid, this year's drive was smaller with drop-offs at the two fire stations. Nevertheless, John Kraetz, Kevin Eden and their team of firefighters filled the stations with hundreds of toys to support Adopt-A-Family and other charities. The gift cards and family games became part of our drive-through parties, while the toys and bikes were made available to families at each food bank location.



- Donor **Margaret Levit** asked all of her family members to tell her their favorite family games, then purchased one of each to donate to Adopt-A-Family. She wanted to be able to provide all family favorites.

- **Hayden Electric, Inc.** provided 50 safety cones and 25 safety vests to keep our clients and volunteers safe during our drive-through parties this year.

## Looking Forward



Once again this past year, we were humbled by the incredible generosity of our donors and the steadfast commitment of our volunteers. Because of this incredible generosity and commitment, we were able to continue to provide for those in need in our communities during a very unusual and difficult year.

In 2020, Foothills Food Bank had more than 17,000 clients visit where we distributed more than 1.1 million pounds of food. In addition, we provided financial aid to more than 720 families. We also took care of their pets with 163,000 pounds of pet food. More than 300 volunteers worked well over 26,000 hours to provide the food and services.

In addition, during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, we provided meals for almost 900 families which included more than 750 turkeys, hams and other holiday meats as well as gift cards to buy the "fixings" to go with the meats. Our "Adopt a Family" program adopted nearly 450 families at Christmas making sure those children did not go without some kind of Christmas gift.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to say thank you to everyone for their support of Foothills Food Bank in 2020 and look forward to a new year where we once again can provide food and services to those in need in our communities.
