Thanks to our dedicated team, food drive organizers and participants, volunteers, and rescue partners, we were able to collect and distribute 1,753,294 pounds of produce, meat, fish, dairy, bakery items and nonperishable food in 2022. And while doing so, launched new programs such as financial preparedness, to help neighbors prepare for tomorrow. Our Senior Market was visited more than 1800 times by neighbors who are 55 years of age and older. And there is so much more that we can do and so many neighbors who can benefit from your generosity.
