The Future's So Bright

For 35 years, Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center has worked tirelessly to build a better future for our neighbors in Cave Creek and the North Valley. Our progress has been monumental — but even after all these years, demand continues. Economic insecurity is at epic levels and the need for food and resources continues – the demand has become greater than we can process at our current facility and we are proud to announce our expansion and new location that will allow us to meet the needs of so many more neighbors in our community.

In 2022, we collected 1.7 million pounds of food for neighbors, but that has supported just the tip of our food insecure iceberg. We can, and must, do more.

Our new location will be on Carefree Highway and 42nd Street, thanks in part to a very creative ground lease offered by the Town of Cave Creek. The facility will double the size of our current warehouse, which will not only allow us to feed more people, but also allow us the opportunity to collaborate with other social service organizations to build a better future.

The food bank quietly launched a \$6.5 million dollar campaign in 2022 to help us kick-start the project, and with the support of generous neighbors and marketable assets and resources, the Food Bank has reached over 50 percent of the ambitious goal.

"The demand for food and assistance in our community is exceeding our current capacity," Leigh Zydonik, Foothills Food Bank's executive director explained. "We simply cannot accept and process enough food at our current location and as the need in our community grows, so must we.

"After over three decades of service, it's time to start our next chapter." Groundbreaking is expected to occur this summer.

Here's the Plan

Our plan is to end hunger in our community. To do so, we need to feed more people and identify and provide resources for those in a variety of situations. Our current 200 square mile service area includes over 300,000 residents. According to statistics, up to 40,000 of these residents are not sure where their next meal will come from. To expand our reach into the community and areas in need, we will build a warehouse and workspace where food, programs and resources are accessible. The new location is a three-acre parcel on Carefree Highway just west of Cave Creek Road, at 42nd Street. We will nearly double warehouse storage and triple refrigeration space with planned access for commercial and private vehicle deliveries.

The Future's So Bright Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the new food bank being built?

Carefree Highway between 41st and 44th Streets, across from Dove Valley Golf Course.

Are you maintaining the pantries in Black Canyon City and New River, as well as mobile and micro-pantries?

Yes. The need remains and we will continue to be a distribution point for both pantries and look forward to building partnerships to continue our outreach.



What's changed in our community?

The food bank has experienced a 48 percent increase year-over-year. After conducting in-depth research, as well as reviewing many well-respected reports, we learned the need for food and resources continues throughout our service area, however, food insecurity is most dense near Black Canyon City, New River, Cordes Lakes and Mayer as well as the corridor along the Loop 101/Aqua Fria Freeway east of I-17. The largest increase in neighbors requesting support are those 55 years old and older.

How much money will the food bank have to borrow?

Our goal is to raise \$6.5 million to build the new facility without debt. We are half-way there with generous donations, the sale of the two properties and cash on hand. With your help, and that of the entire community, we will be able to complete the build without debt.

Will you sell the current building in Cave Creek?

Yes, as well as our parking lot across the street. Foothills Food Bank owns both properties.

How will moving impact current beneficiaries?

Some residents within our immediate area may be impacted, but the distance to the new location is five miles closer to the freeway. By moving to a major thoroughfare, we will heighten visibility and make access from areas of highest need easier.

When will the new food bank open?

Construction schedules are still in pencil, but we anticipate Q3, 2024.



Everyone Has a Story. Here's Ours...

Volunteers, donors, neighbors in need - their inspiring stories all feed our purpose. Last year, we are proud to have given a hand up to thousands of our neighbors and we collected almost two-million pounds of food for distribution. Since 1988, it has been our mission to support our entire community, but as the need has grown, so has ours.

Our goal is to end hunger in our service area by making sure no one goes to bed hungry and that everyone is secure in their ability to feed their family. To do so, we need a little room to grow - not only to meet today's need, but the needs of our growing community.

We are raising \$6.5 million to begin the next chapter, debt free, in a new efficient and accessible homebase. This will allow us to provide additional services, training, education. It will also allow us to accept large, money-saving donations and bulk orders while keeping our hundreds of volunteers safe.

New Food Bank Design will be Welcoming, Flexible, Green

Foothills Food Bank is excited to say goodbye to drab and drafty warehouse jungles of the past with the announcement of a new campus breaking ground later this year. According to food bank Executive Director Leigh Zydonik, "we do more than just provide food, and with the new campus, we can do that, and so much more."

The Foothills Food Bank's new facility will allow the not-for-profit to accept and distribute twice as much food as before, but also to provide warmth and comfort to those seeking support. "The new campus will allow us to help neighbors with training, financial coaching, self-help programming and so much more," she concluded.

The new food bank campus, to be located on Carefree Highway a mile west of Cave Creek Road, will be a 15,000 square foot facility that will provide more than double the capacity for food storage and freezer and cooling space. This allows room to accept and process more food and will help reduce waste due to increased cooler capacity. The new warehouse will also feature three loading docks including one for personal donations, and two for the food bank's vans, trucks and commercial vehicles.

Resource and training space will allow the food bank to host seminars and educational events, something the existing food bank has never enjoyed. There will also be space for community partners, such as county and state social service providers, who can assist neighbors in obtaining additional resources and a test kitchen for additional events for the community.

As a part of the Town of Cave Creek low-cost lease, the campus will include an office suite for the City Water Department with a separate entrance and parking.

The food bank has also set the bar high to become a green building, designing every aspect to reduce the overall impact of the campus on the natural environment. The plan is to take advantage of solar power options, use of sustainable materials and healthy indoor environmental features.

Community Support Abounds
