Hope Grows as Foothills Food Bank Breaks Ground on New Facility



Under the bright sun and amidst an electrifying atmosphere, the Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center celebrated a significant milestone earlier this month in Cave Creek, breaking ground on a new campus, signaling that construction is just around the corner.

Notable attendees included Cave Creek Mayor Bob Morris, Vice Mayor Kathryn Royer, Carefree Mayor John Crane, One AZ Credit Union representatives, dedicated volunteers, community representatives, and the construction team. Senators Mark Kelly and Kyrsten Sinema were also represented. Unfortunately, due to limited parking and challenging terrain, the public could not attend, but a video of the event is available on the Foothills Food Bank YouTube channel.

Mayor Morris highlighted the Town of Cave Creek's vital role in the food bank's future in his remarks. The town offered a unique land lease opportunity, providing a low-cost, long-term lease that includes a permanent solution for the town's Water Services office, which currently resides in trailers on site.

During the ceremony, the first naming sponsor, One AZ Credit Union, stepped forward. Greg Russo, Central Regional President, presented a check symbolizing their commitment and the branding of the One AZ Resource Room within the new building.

Leigh Zydonik, Executive Director of Foothills Food Bank, shared, "I can't believe the day has finally come. This new facility will allow us to serve more neighbors and greatly increase our capacity to store and distribute food and provide additional resources. The new campus will allow us to help neighbors with training, financial coaching, self-help programming, and so much more." She added that none of this would be possible without the support and generous donations from the community.

The new food bank campus, situated at Carefree Highway and 41st Street, will encompass 15,000 square feet, effectively doubling food storage capacity.

Compassion in Action

Foothills Caring Corps Deliver a Dose of Kindness

A unique partnership has emerged between the Foothills Caring Corps and Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center, as together they focus on giving a helping hand to the elderly, mobility-challenged, and those in need. It's a story of compassion in action.

Foothills Caring Corps' mission has always been to promote independence and enhance the quality of life for seniors and adults with disabling conditions. Their primary programs help with the challenges of transportation, nutrition, and social isolation.

"We provide services, but our focus is on caring," said Brent Downs, Foothills Caring Corps' Executive Director. "Our team of volunteers deliver meals, and provide other services, but what they give of themselves is so much more than that. The conversation a neighbor has with one of our volunteers may be the only conversation they have all day – and we are honored to provide that friendly voice."

For individuals facing difficulties in accessing transportation, Foothills Caring Corps provides non-urgent medical transportation and shopping assistance to neighbors in a 250+ square mile service area. On select Mondays, they provide transportation to those who would like to visit the Foothills Food Bank's Senior Market, fostering connections along with groceries. Additionally, they deliver customized food boxes from the Foothills Food Bank to those in need but who are isolated or experience mobility challenges. Volunteers at the food bank pack the boxes for these clients in smaller quantities that the neighbors can handle easily, based on their dietary requirements.

Downs has spent his career in community service and is enthusiastic about collaborating with the food bank. Food Bank Executive Director, Leigh Zydonik, said her team has seamlessly integrated their mission with Foothills Caring Corps, creating a synergy that benefits the community's most vulnerable neighbors.

According to Downs, this partnership is about more than just food and transportation; it's about nurturing the spirits of the elderly and vulnerable within the community; something Downs refers to as "a lifeline of compassion."

"We are thankful for our partnership with Brent and the Foothills Caring Corps team," Zydonik said. "Together we are making our neighborhood a better place for all."
