Pretty in Pink, 2024 Mirabel Women's Luncheon Raises the Bar

The Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center has been serving its clients for more than three decades. For a third of those years, the women of Mirabel, a private, residential community in Scottsdale, have come together to support the work of the staff and volunteers who make a tremendous difference in the lives of the people they serve.

The Mirabel Women's Foothills Food Bank luncheon has become a highly anticipated event. Now in its twelfth year, the 2024 luncheon raised more than \$239,000, topping last year's donations by 15 percent. This year's Barbie-themed event dazzled attendees with its pink décor and delectable stiletto-shaped desserts, making it an undeniable hit.

Mirabel Women's Food Bank Committee Co-chairs Linda Howes and Sunny Chico were thrilled with the outcome of the event. "The committee had so much fun with this year's theme," said Linda. "Better than a movie, the real Mirabel women dazzled in pink and graciously opened their hearts and wallets for luncheon and raffle tickets and silent auction items."

"And the generosity of our Mirabel Community is amazing," Sunny added. "Not only do they support our annual event, many donate their time to the food bank. Mirabel members Jill Muth and Joe McCabe serve on the board of directors and others in our community volunteer by stocking food or driving vans to pick up food for distribution."

Mirabel women are proud of their alliance with the Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center. Through its annual fundraising luncheon more than \$1,200,000 has been raised. Knowing an impactful difference is made in people's lives keeps the Mirabel Women coming back each year.

New Stop for Mobile Foodshare

Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center's Mobile Foodshare program has expanded, partnering with St. Luke Catholic Church near 7th Avenue and the Loop 101 in the north valley. This collaboration addresses a crucial need in our community by bringing essential food resources closer to those who need them.

New Food Bank Campus Naming Rights Announced

The Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center proudly announces a unique designation and naming rights to a local group that has supported the food bank for more than 12 years. The food bank's guest-choice mini-market, to be housed on the new campus on Carefree Highway, will be known as the *Mirabel Marketplace*, thanks to a naming rights sponsorship granted to Mirabel Women Community-Driven Committee from the private residential community of Mirabel in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Leigh Zydonik, Executive Director of Foothills Food Bank, expressed heartfelt gratitude to the Mirabel Women's committee for their unwavering support. Their journey began with donations of snack packs for school-aged children in the community who needed food on weekends and vacation periods but has evolved into so much more.

"The group's 2024 luncheon raised more than \$239,000, bringing the total donated over the years to more than \$1,200,000," Zydonik concluded. "We are so appreciative and humbled by their efforts on our behalf."

This is the second naming opportunity announced, with OneAZ Credit Union being the first organization to stake sponsorship.

Together, the Community of Mirabel Women and OneAZ Credit Union are laying the groundwork for a brighter future for our community.

Thanks to a \$400,000 grant from Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust, the food bank is one giant step closer to reaching its' capital campaign goal.

In the past two years, Foothills Food Bank has seen a significant increase in client volume, jumping over 41% above pre-COVID rates. The food bank serves a 200-square-mile area, primarily in Maricopa County.

The forthcoming comprehensive program center and warehouse will be such an asset for our community and particularly its targeted support for youth and older adult populations," said Steve Zabilski, president and CEO of Virginia G. Construction on Schedule

"We are excited to share that construction of the new food bank campus is on schedule," said Leigh Zydonik, Executive Director, Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center. "As the footings are poured and walls begin to go up in the next few weeks, the dream of feeding and serving more people in our community is coming closer to a reality," she added.

The new food bank campus, at Carefree Highway and 41st Street, will encompass 15,000 square feet, effectively doubling food storage capacity and offering enhanced freezer and cooling facilities.

Fundraising events continue and the food bank has received substantial grants from Virginia G. Piper Trust, St. Mary's Food Bank and a naming sponsorship from One AZ Credit Union.
