We are excited to celebrate the grand opening of the new Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center campus: a milestone marking a new era of service, compassion, and expanded impact.

Located in Cave Creek, Arizona, this purpose-built campus reflects our deep commitment to meeting the growing needs of families, seniors, veterans, and individuals across 15 zip codes and 200+ square miles in northern Maricopa County. More than just a food bank, it is a hub of hope designed to uplift and empower.

At the heart of our work is the Mirabel Marketplace, a client-choice food pantry, where visitors select items that best match their family's preferences, dietary needs, and cultural traditions. This model is unique in Arizona and helps preserve dignity while ensuring healthy food and choices that truly fits each unique household.

Beyond food distribution, our new Resource Center will offer cooking demonstrations, nutrition education, and life skills classes that foster healthier lifestyles and long-term food security. By addressing the root causes of hunger, we aim to restore stability and build resilience.

The new campus also serves as our main distribution hub, enabling deeper outreach into the service area. With nearly three times the warehouse and cold storage space of our previous facility, we can now accept and process more food and deliver it efficiently to our community partners and those in need.

### Economic Uncertainty Infusing Concerns in North Valley

As debates over federal nutrition assistance cuts continue in Washington, families across Arizona, especially in areas like the North Valley, are already feeling the weight of rising prices. For many neighbors, decisions about whether to pay for utilities, medication, or groceries are becoming more frequent and more heartbreaking.

At Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center in Cave Creek, Executive Director Leigh Zydonik sees the strain firsthand.

"We're hearing stories from people who've never needed help before," said Zydonik. "When your rent is up, groceries are up, and gas is up, but your income is not, it becomes a daily balancing act. Food is often the first thing to go, and that's where we step in."

Unlike some larger food banks, Foothills Food Bank and Resource Center does not receive federal funding. Shelves are stocked thanks to generous retail rescue partners, local donors, community food drives, and partnerships with local businesses. But as economic pressures mount, the need is growing, and the cost to meet that need is climbing, too.

"While we're not directly impacted by the federal program cuts," Zydonik explains, "our community is. Seniors, our largest demographic, along with working parents, and veterans in our neighborhoods may lose access to other services. That ripple effect comes straight to our door."

The food bank operates on a lean budget, stretching every dollar to serve thousands of people each year with dignity and compassion. But Zydonik says that without increased support, the ability to meet the growing demand may be compromised.

"We can't do this without consistent support," she said. "Food and funds must come in every day. That's the reality. And as the pressure builds on families, we're asking our community to stand with us now more than ever."

## A Brave First Step Leads to Generational Change

Mark's journey to the Foothills Food Bank & Resource Center began in a moment of personal crisis. He had lost his job, was struggling with his mental health, and was doing his best to raise his young grandson alone. Groceries became a stretch, and every day felt like a mountain to climb. However, everything began to shift when he connected with a community navigator at the food bank.



With compassionate support, Mark received healthy groceries that eased the burden. He also received help replacing critical documents, including his long-lost Social Security card and a valid state ID, which opened doors to additional resources, including assistance with his medications, helping him regain stability and focus.

Today, Mark is healthier and more confident. He is building a stronger future for himself and his grandson. He is learning how to face challenges with resilience and is passing those lessons on to the next generation.

Stories like Mark's are a simple reminder that when one neighbor finds the strength to move forward, entire families are lifted. This is the power of compassion in action.
